# Did you know?

There are 22 public library entities serving Nevada: ten county libraries, nine district libraries, one city-county library, one municipal library district, and one tri-county library system. While public library service is available in all regions of the state, some areas have a very minimal level of service, and much of that populace is underserved.

Large libraries support the two University of Nevada campuses in Reno and Las Vegas. There are also five colleges with main libraries and branches cooperatively linked with the catalog and circulation services of Nevada's University and College system.

Nevada has 17 public school districts including over 550 school sites. At least 35 special libraries offer varying levels of service to the public throughout the state.

Elko Gets Ready to Read Sponsored by Barrick Gold North America, Elko County Library's "Ready, Set, READ!" summer reading program is scheduled to run June 13th through July 23rd with a wide range of activities available for children of all ages. Children will track their reading minutes during the summer, checking in with the Library and reporting their progress occasionally as they earn incentives and participate in other activities.

> Toddlers (ages 0-3) participate by completing nine pre-literacy activities, with a parent, while having the opportunity to attend a monthly toddler time and/or a weekly story time. Youth (ages 4-11) read 2 hours a week, complete a report, and share their thoughts, about their reading, on a weekly basis with the librarian. Youth also have the opportunity to participate in weekly crafts, three Day Camps (Armed Services Boot Camp, Beginning Hip-Hop Dance, and Yoga for Youth), and a monthly Tween Book & Movie Club along with Maker Monday activities. Teens (ages 12-18) can record reading/volunteer minutes while having the choice to attend two day camps (Birds/Wilderness Survival and Hip-Hop for Teens) along with the Teen Book Club and Maker Monday activities offered by the Library. The five teens recording the most minutes

during the summer will receive a "reading" mug filled with gift certificates from local Elko businesses.

Other activities include an Ice Cream Social (sponsored by Spoon Me), a Family Scavenger Hunt, a LEGO Read Day, and a Picnic at the city park. These activities are designed to encourage the entire family to be part of the reading experience.

In conjunction with the Children's Summer Reading Program the Elko County Library is offering an Adult Summer Reading Program. The "Ready, Set, READ" theme is promoting a healthy lifestyle. With health and fitness in mind the library will be hosting two classes (Introduction to Yoga and Juicing Basics). Another item on the agenda of promoting exercise and reading is Exercise Your Mind Bingo. Adults will also be able to participate in weekly drawings for the book reviews they submit. Patrons are welcome to relax at the library while being creative with our freeform artwork Zentangle table.

During the "Ready, Set, READ!" Summer Reading Program Elko County Library will be offering "Read **Down Your Fines."** A dollar will be waived from the patrons' account for each set of 15 minutes they read at the library. The maximum total of fines that can be waived is \$10.00. This is a great incentive to encourage patrons with large balances on their accounts to reduce their fines.

# Washoe County Library Brings its Collection to Amazon

An interesting app called Koios lets patrons check the library for a title before they buy on Amazon. This free download lets you know if an item you're viewing on Amazon is available through Washoe County Library System (WCLS). It's the perfect tool for current cardholders and other readers hoping to save money.

"We want people to easily find the library's resources," says WCLS Internet Services Librarian John Andrews. "People are already using Amazon to discover new books and authors. Offering Koios to our users brings us closer to our goal of connecting with our users online, where they already are."

Usually, a library's collection is only searchable through the library's website. But Koios allows users see if the title is available at their library right on Amazon, so they never miss an opportunity to borrow instead of buy. Koios is available in twenty libraries nationwide and is now available in Washoe County. (from WCLS website)
